BSN – Bachelor of Science in Nursing (134-135 semester hours)

Graduates are qualified to take the National Council Licensing Examination – RN (NCLEX-RN) to become an RN (registered nurse) in Ohio or any other state. While Miami's regional campuses are open admission, the nursing program is selective and competitive. Students can take non-nursing and Miami Plan courses if they do not yet meet the criteria to be considered for admission.

Individuals who have a felony conviction may be denied the opportunity to take the licensing examination. An applicant for licensure will be asked whether or not he/she has a felony conviction, as outlined in Section 4723.28 of the Ohio Revised Code. The Ohio Board of Nursing has the right to deny any individual who has a felony conviction the opportunity to sit for the NCLEX-RN.
